75-year-old man with red/purple cheek nodule.

30-year-old man with skin colored wrist nodule. Previously ulcerated 6 months ago, treated with incision & drainage plus antibiotics. No tissue sent for pathology at that time. Nodule persisted and grew. Now excised and sent to pathology.
