Clinical history:

1.65 Female. Presented with post-menopausal reddish-brown vaginal discharge.

2. Transvaginal ultrasound showing an enlarged right ovary (approximately 4cm) with a solid, highly vascular lesion. Ultrasound findings were deemed as suspicious for malignancy.
 3. Pathology received a total hysterectomy with bilateral salpingo-opherectomy, as well as right side wall peritoneal biopsy and peritoneal washings for cytology.
